## How we can pray in "desperate times":

1. Remember who God is and \_\_\_\_\_.
  - a. Glorious Father & Redeemer (63:15-16).
  - b. Unique God who acts on behalf of his people (64:3-5).
  - c. Creator (8).
  
2. Be gut-level honest in \_\_\_\_\_.
  - a. Distant from God (63:17-19).
  - b. Dirty (64:6-7).
  
3. Ask God for \_\_\_\_\_.
  - a. Notice (63:15).
  - b. Return (63:17).
  - c. Reveal yourself powerfully (64:1-2).
  - d. Forgive (9).
  - e. Help (10-12).
